

Call for Ph.D. Student Forum

PHD STUDENT FORUM TO BE HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH IEEE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON ADVANCED NETWORKS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS (ANTS 2018)

(ANTS 2018 - PhD Student Forum)

— The PhD forum provides an opportunity for research students to showcase their original yet incomplete 'work-in-progress'. Apart from the TPC reviews, presentations would allow authors an opportunity to have detailed discussions with the conference attendees and obtain feedback on their work. The forum also encourages authors to hold live and/or interactive demonstrations, if relevant, as part of their presentations.

HOW TO SUBMIT:

Original submissions are invited for ANTS 2018 PhD forum in the broad areas of wired networks, wireless networks, and network applications. Authors must submit an extended abstract having a minimum length of two pages long and a maximum of six pages, using EDAS (<http://edas.info/N24727>) on or before July 15, 2018. The abstract should describe the main motivation and results in sufficient detail to allow the reviewers to assess the potential contribution of the work. The abstracts should be authored by active PhD Students only and should be at least two pages long in two-column IEEE format. A set of 5-7 keywords should accompany the abstract. Abstracts will not be archived, and will not appear in the conference proceedings. The authors will not need to sign the IEEE copyright form. Abstracts will be reviewed by the TPC and accepted works are required to be presented at the conference. As mentioned, the selected abstracts will not appear in IEEE-Xplore. Submitted abstracts should be unpublished, and if selected the authors must present their work at the conference.

As it will not be copyrighted, authors are free to submit the same in another conference or journal. — PHD STUDENT FORUM CO-CHAIRS
