## IEEE Power Engineering Society Talk – History of the LOLE Index

The Boise PE Chapter held a Technical Meeting in Boise at the Idaho Power building on October 7th. The topic “Early History on the Application of Probability Methods in the Evaluation of Generating Capacity Requirements” was presented by world expert in the area of Power System Reliability Dr. Roy Billinton from Saskatchewan University in Canada. Dr. Billinton focused his talk on the early application of probability methods in the evaluation of generating capacity adequacy and reserve requirements in an electric power system. One of the objectives was to illustrate the evolution of the loss of load expectation (LOLE) from a concept to a numerical system index 0.1 day/year that has been widely accepted as a system standard for over 50 years. The meeting was broadcasted via WebEx to IEEE members of several chapters in Region 6.

## IEEE Senior Membership

Are you interested in becoming a senior member of the IEEE? Read on to find out the benefits, eligibility requirements and how to apply.

IEEE senior membership is recognition of your technical and professional excellence. As a newly elevated senior member, you will receive an engraved plaque, and a letter of commendation can be sent to your employer. You will be eligible to hold executive IEEE volunteer positions, and you will get a \$25 coupon to use to join an IEEE society.

To be eligible, you must meet qualifications for IEEE membership including being an engineer, scientist, educator, technical executive or originator in any IEEE-designated field. You must have been in professional practice for at least ten years and have shown significant performance over a period of at least five years. Note that educational experience is credited towards time in professional practice (three years credit if you hold a bachelor's degree, four years for a bachelor's and master's degree, and five years for a doctorate).

Information on the application process is available on the IEEE senior member website. As part of the application process, you will need to identify three current senior members to serve as references.
