The meeting started with the Chair of the Sub-Committee, R. Chandramouli, welcoming the members of the TCCN subcommittee. Since the sub-committee was formed in June 2006, a lot of progress has been made in the last six months and the sub-committee is all set to become a full committee with the support of IEEE.
