IEEE/IAS PULP & PAPER INDUSTRY COMMITTEE ANNUAL CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES OF THE FULL COMMITTEE SHERATON CENTRE HOTEL TORONTO, ONTARIO

JUNE 17, 2002

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Roger Jones called the meeting to order at 1:05 PM. He welcomed everyone to Toronto and the Full committee meeting. He then asked everyone in turn to introduce him or herself. Allan Lowe circulated a meeting sign in sheet and asked all attendees to sign, as it is the official attendance list. He also circulated the committee roster for people to make corrections. 75 committee members attended.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Rory Johnson announced that the minutes from the last Main Committee meeting had been sent out. A motion was made and passed to accept the minutes. Rory reported the following:

Rory reviewed the status of the method for issuing the minutes. The use of zip files to issue the 2001 conference committee meeting minutes had numerous problems. A suggestion was made at the interim meeting to setup an FTP site and post the notes there. Problems with finding someone to host the site prevented that from being accomplished (See Old Business). With deletion of the membership list from the report the file appeared to be small enough to email without zipping. Executive minutes were sent first and worked so followed with the main committee minutes. 12 emails were returned but only 2 because the file was too large. Will continue to use this method until a better alternative is found. 10 emails were returned due to incorrect or nonexistent addresses. Points up the importance of keeping email addresses current.

A suggestion had been made to post the committee membership on the web site where the committee minutes would be posted. Rory had agreed to add the list to the web site but as that failed to materialize he indicated he would d attempt to send it as a separate email when the conference committee minutes are sent.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Rory Johnson reported that 19 members were in attendance at the Executive Committee meeting. The meeting started at 5:02PM Sunday evening and adjourned at 6:37PM. Full agenda with very good discussions.

2001 PORTLAND CONFERENCE REPORT

George Matto reported the conference attendance was 186 full, 26 one day and 8 life members for a total of 220. 167 people attended the social event and there were 63 guests registered. 60 people attended the tutorials and 27 the tour. The conference had a profit of \$21,000. \$7,000 was given to the Local Committee and the remaining \$14,000 was sent to the National Committee. Of the \$7,000 returned to the local committee all may be granted to the Local IAS chapter. Audit was completed and included in the final report sent to the IEEE National Office. To date they have received no response approving the report.

2000 ATLANTA CONFERENCE CLOSE OUT REPORT

Charlie Canty related that the IEEE still were not acknowledging receipt of the final report and as such had not issued an approval either.

TREASURER REPORT/CONFERENCE AUDITS

Blake Lloyd reported that the IEEE, PPIC bank balance is still \$0. The Atlanta and Portland Conference audits are both now awaiting final approvals from the IEEE audit board. Committee suggested Blake send a letter to IEEE headquarters stating that the IEEE, IAS, PPIC assumes the audits to be approved. Blake will do.

STANDING SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

MEMBERSHIP

Alan Lowe reported that membership had dropped to 115 members. Since the October Interim Meeting, there have been no new members, 2 resignations and 6 dropped for nonattendance, retirement or have transferred out of the industry. There are 2 pending applications for membership from Tim Hoy and Gary Wetzel. Members are dropped if they have not participated in the committee for 2 years. At the interim meeting in October 49 members were present, 43 requested excused absences and 32 were unexcused. See appendix for full report.

Membership roster is available but some of the email addresses may be incorrect as the Access report truncated some of the longest ones. Alan had copies of the subcommittee rosters and asked the chairman to pass them out at their meetings so folks could update them. Return changes to him.

Jim Rooks updated the initiative to increase the Senior Member population in the PPIC. 23 PPIC Members were listed in the interim meeting as being considered for advancement to Senior Member. Out of that list 15 are now Senior Members. 72 members (57%) of the PPIC committee are now Senior Members compared to 7% for all of IEEE. Claude Hudson has been advanced to Senior Member and Jim suggested presenting Claude with his certificate at the Wednesday banquet. Jim asked the memberships cooperation in encouraging other members to provide him the information to submit on their behalf for approval to Senior Member.

MAILING LIST

Roger Jones reported for Bob Morse that the mailing list disk was updated with the corrections from the 2001 Portland Conference mailing list books, the 2001 conference registration disk and added names sent to him during the year. Bob sent the revised mailing list disk to John Kay for the Toronto Conference Committee to use in generating mailing labels. Email address has been added to the mailing list for those who listed it on their conference registration form. He as ked that an announcement be made at the conference that the mailing list books would be available near the registration desk and asked that all attendees check the books to update their information and anyone else from their company. Bob also indicated that he was retiring from active participation in the committee and as mailing list coordinator.

PUBLICITY

Ron Meihofer reported that the publicity release on the 2001 Technical Conference held in Portland, Oregon was published in the IEEE Industry Applications Magazine January/February 2002 issue. Announcements for the 2002 conference in Toronto, Ontario to be held June 17-21 were sent to various trade magazines including IEEE Spectrum, IAS, Pulp &Paper and Paper Age. The report from the Toronto Conference will probably be published in the November/December issue of the IAS magazine.

PAPER AWARDS AND PUBLICATIONS

Laurie Chilar reported 8 papers were submitted to the IAS Magazine and 17 papers were recommended for publication in the IAS Transactions Register. 9 have been published in the most recent transactions and 1 in the magazine. About 70% of the conference papers wind up in IEEE publications. She acknowledged the work of the paper reviewers for the 2002 conference. Certificates (New this year) will be presented to the prize paper award winners at the conference this Friday.

FELLOWS NOMINATIONS

Clayton Reid reported that John Holmquist was elected as an IEEE Fellow in November. He has already received his certificate from the IEEE but Clayton would like to make a special presentation at the PPIC Conference Banquet. Another committee has nominated Shoaib Kahn to the IEEE Fellow board. PPIC may nominate in the future if this nomination is not successful. Clayton Reid has also been nominated by the PPIC to the Fellow Board.

Clayton distributed the form to nominate PPIC members for IAS awards. He indicated Lanny Floyd was going to be presented the Harold Kaufman Award.

PPIC AWARDS

Russ Thrift indicated the 2002 Conference Meritorious Service Award will be presented to Dave Rollay and the Meritorious Engineering Award to Mark Weaver this Wednesday at the banquet. Russ encouraged every individual on the committee to recognize them and also read the write-ups on each award winner. Nominations for next year's awards need to be made by the interim meeting.

Liaison Reports

PAPTEC (CPPA)

PAPTECH (CPPA) annual meeting is in Montreal the end of January 2003.

IEEE/IAS

Clayton reported the IAS Conference would be held in September. Clayton is the new awards chairman for IAS.

TAPPI

Burt Judson reported that the next TAPPI PCE&I Conference is to be held in the fall of 2003 with the pulp division. Conference attendance was a main topic of discussion at their last conference also. Electrical portion of PCE&I meets this afternoon. He also announced that the next TAPPI Paper Machines Drives Short Course is scheduled for October 2002 in Camas, WA.

IEEE - STANDARDS COORDINATING

Dan Daly reported that SCC 18 has not met since our last meeting. We are in between Code cycles. They will be meeting next January to provide voting instructions to the IEEE representatives on proposals for the 2005 NEC.

One IEEE standard of interest to this Committee came out for ballot this past year, *IEEE C95.6*, *Standard for Safety Levels With Respect to Human Exposure to Electromagnetic Fields*, *0 to 3 kHz*. Information on the ballot was sent to the officers. Several members of PPIC joined the balloting committee. The standard will be published later this year.

IEEE - IAS SAFETY COMMITTEE

Larry Thomas attended the IAS Safety Committee "Electrical Safety Workshop" in Mobile, AL as the liaison from the PPIC. The workshop is going on 10 years and had over 250 attendees. No technical papers are presented at the workshop, just various presentations. The next workshop will be held in Houston, TX February 3,2003.

OPERATING SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

EMMC

Rhonda Banks reported that her committee had 10 persons present this morning out of a membership of 20. EMMC had 6 excused absences and 4 unexcused absences with 1 guest. Rick Watkins and George Matto volunteered to operate the lights for the first session. Paper reviewer for the 2003 conference is Larry Menche and the alternate Dave Durocher. The tour of the Niagara Falls Hydro Plant may allow for a view of a generator torn down for maintenance. Should be interesting to see turn of the century engineering.

John said he has a strong committee supporting the conference and feels everyone should enjoy the activities.

Roger Jones then sent out a request for help to find any additional papers. 8 more papers were submitted (6 came from the PDS subcommittee).

FUTURE CONFERENCES

2003 - CHARLESTON, SC

Rhonda Banks reports that the hotel has changed from the Charleston Place to the Westin Francis Marion downtown. It is a new resort on the national registry. Signed tentative contract with the hotel subject to IEEE approval. Conference dates are June 15 to 20. The hotel rate is \$139. Soliciting for committee members.

2004 - VANCOUVER, BC

Phil Fransen has stepped down as conference chairman. Mark Weaver is now the new chairman. He reported that they are still on schedule for the 2004 conference in Vancouver. He is presently looking at alternative venues for the conference.

2005 - JACKSONVILLE, FL

Rich Butler reports that in 2005 the PPIC conference is on for Jacksonville, FL June 20 to the 24. The IEEE cement conference was held at the Adams Mark Hotel on the waterfront last year. Working on a contract with the Adams Mark for a room rate of \$135 per night with an assumed attendance of 200 people. Working on ideas for technical and spouse tours.

2006 - ST. LOUIS, MO

Jim Closson had volunteered to be the chairman for the 2006 conference in St. Louis.

2007 - MILWAUKEE, WI

Dave Rollay is looking for someone that will volunteer to be the local Chairman for a Milwaukee, WI conference in 2007. He does have commitment from people to serve on the committee.

OLD BUSINESS

Dave Rollay reported that arrangements have been made for the interim meeting in Atlanta, GA. It will be October 26 (Saturday) and 27 (Sunday) at the Westin Atlanta Airport. Meeting will be funded by the Charleston Conference. Dave suggested that everyone register at the hotel early. A discussion ensued over concern about Saturday and Sunday travel. Many wondered if there was a Midwest location alternative that would be more central to all of the members. There was also a suggestion that people could possibly join by teleconference. Discussed the cost and logistic problems associated with teleconferencing. A suggestion was made that the subcommittees could take a poll as to who would attend the meeting in Atlanta. A follow-up could then be done if the attendance appeared to be low. It was decided that the executive committee would look at suggestions for future interim meetings.

Blake Lloyd reported that he had intended to establish a PPIC web/FTP site but his company (IRIS Engineering) was unable to host. If another company were willing to host he could easily set it up. He indicated IEEE is willing to host but maintenance is difficult. Blake said he would investigate web-hosting companies and the costs associated with them. He would present the proposals at the interim meeting and discuss funding from the conference.

These nominees are all well qualified for office by virtue of their professional ability and experience and service to the PPIC. The Nominating Committee was pleased to recommend these candidates for office. The slate of candidates was unanimously elected.

The Executive Committee selected John Kay as the new Mailing List Coordinator.

Jim Rooks suggested that the committee should adopt an open door policy for Student attendance at the Conference. Someone asked how the committee contacts local universities and college. Suggested that the committee adopt a more formal process. IAS apparently has a conference luncheon for students and charges them for conference attendance on a variable basis (as little as possible). John Kay indicated that he had contacted all universities in southern Ontario. One reason for the poor response could be that the conference is in June after most universities have ended their

sessions for the summer break. One good place for interfacing to student groups may be through the local IAS chapter. Also suggested that it needs faculty support to succeed.

Charlie Canty Chairman of the adhoc committee on improving conference attendance indicated they have not formally met yet. Comments on conference attendance.

- ◆ Tutorials bring in users. It should be a focus area for the committee. If don't will be missing the boat. Should strategically target this area. PDH's (Professional Development Hours) may be an attraction. IAS can help the committee organize to get CEU's.
- ♦ Look at the possibility of including tangential business as a potential growth area. Example would be the converting business or the wood products sector. Do we just have to focus on Pulp & Paper.
- ♦ Develop flyer to send out to mill personnel extolling the virtues of attending the conference.

A suggestion was made that the committee considers a special type of celebration for the Vancouver conference in 2004, as it is the conferences 50th Anniversary.
