2010 PPIC COMMITTEE INTERIM MEETING Sheraton Airport Hotel, Atlanta Georgia October 25, 2010 Minutes recorded by John A. Kay, PPIC Secretary

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WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS – Rhonda Banks

Rhonda called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM. He welcomed everyone to Atlanta and the Full committee interim meeting. She then asked everyone in turn to introduce him or herself. A meeting signin sheet was circulated for all attendees to indicate their presence.

Rhonda also announced, for those that did not know yet, the Claude Hudson had passed away earlier this fall. Claude Hudson was one of the charter members of this committee. A memorial shall be included in the annual conference information.

2) REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF CONFERENCE MEETING – ALEX WU

Alex Wu reported that the conference meeting minutes from the San Antonio conference meeting were issued. These minutes have not yet been posted on the committee website www.pulpandpapercommittee.com. Bert Judson motioned to approve the minutes and was seconded by Alan Lowe. The minutes were approved by the full committee.

3) EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT – John Kay

John reported that 12 members were in attendance at the Executive Committee meeting last night held on October 24, 2010 (Sunday) from 6:10 PM to 7:45 PM.

Some of the topics of interest were:

- a) The 2011 Author's Guide is available and ready for authors use. Thanks Rhonda. She has included clearer instructions to authors for submitting papers to ScholarOne Manuscripts.
- b) There continues to be lengthy discussion with regard to the PPIC Sustainability and Perpetuation Councils.

Many ideas continue to be explored and some of them being:

- i) Firm up the preliminary technical papers list by February every year so that promotions can go out earlier to the mill management. Alex is charged to expedite all sponsors and authors this year!
- ii) Promote good tutorials to the young mill engineers.
- iii) Continued promotion of the conference through other venues associated with the Wood Product Industries.
- iv) Emphasis of the training benefits of attending this technical conference.
- v) Work continues on the development of an Emeritus group
- c) Nominations will be left open for a brief time for nomination for the "Meritorious Engineering" and "Meritorious Service" Awards. Official deadline for submissions is that date of the interim full committee meting.
- d) We have several open volunteer positions including Unusual Failure Moderator, Perpetuation Council Chairperson and Committee Web Site master. Those interested are to contact Rhonda.
- e) John Kay has created several good reference checklists for Authors, Sponsors and Tutorial Presenters. These will be posted on the conference website to be downloaded.

4) TREASURER'S REPORT/CONFERENCE AUDITS - JOHN KAY (for Greg Drewiski)

John Kay reported in Greg's absence the financial status of our current, past and future conferences as follows:

2007 Conference - John Malinowski

Audit was completed with a surplus of \$47,891 returned to the IEEE. CLOSED

2008 Conference – Richard Turner (Rory Johnson)

Data has been sent to the IEEE for the final audit. At present, we have not yet received the audit report from IEEE internal audit. All documents for this conference have been received and the conference is considered "Ready to Close" pending receipt of the final audit report. It is expected we will have the audit report from this conference soon. The expectations are for a very small surplus around \$5,000. Financial summary, close out of the bank account and the return of the IEEE loan was completed last year.

2009 Conference - Robert Adams

Robert's team did a great job on their conference as they monitored their costs & budgets. The audit is completed, the results confirmed and they returned a surplus of **\$12,357** back to the IEEE. **CLOSED**

2010 Conference – Peter Baen (report given by John Kay)

Pam Gold, San Antonio 2010 Local Committee Finance Chair, has submitted her preliminary report, indicating that this year's conference was not financially successful. There are some discrepancies in this report and what was shared at the conference. I still contend that we had:

- 121 conference attendees and
- 39 registered guests

Sadly there's no way that we can massage the numbers to suggest a financial success, but none of the financials will reflect how much more difficult it could have been. The good news is that because of the extraordinary success that our sister conference, the IEEE Petroleum & Chemical Conference (PCIC) held later in San Antonio, we were able to benefit from them. Because of their need for overflow space, our guest room night attrition penalty fees, of over \$25K, were avoided. Some other incidental costs were also absorbed by the PCIC as well.

c) PUBLICITY - ROB BOTELER

No Report given. Rhonda did provide a report on the communication of the prize papers. The San Antonio conference paper awards were published in the 2010 Sept/Oct edition of the IEEE Industry Application Magazine.

d) PAPER AWARDS/MAGAZINE AND TRANSACTIONS SUBMITTALS – MARK WEAVER

No formal report. Our papers where submitted shortly after our June conference.

e) PPIC AWARDS NOMINATION - RORY JOHNSON

Rory Johnson was not in attendance to provide his report. Rhonda provided a report verbal report on his behalf. We have one nomination and will leave nominations open for a couple of weeks for late nominations, even though our operating guide specifies they are to be submitted by this date

f) FELLOWS NOMINATIONS – JOHN KAY

John Kay reported that four committee members through various IEEE Societies have been nominated for the 2011 Fellows class as follows:

Blake Lloyd has been resubmitted for consideration via another society.

Chuck Mozina was submitted through the Power Engineering Society.

Ron Simpson has been resubmitted for consideration through our conference.

John A. Kay has also been resubmitted for consideration through our conference.

The IEEE Fellows Review Committee does not issue their report until late November so we will not know until next year's conference. If any candidate were successful, he will inform the committee via email.

To be considered for nomination, one must hold a Senior Member grade at the time the nomination is submitted and shall have been a member in good standing in any grade for a period of five years or more preceding 1 January of the year of elevation.

One also needs a nominator who does NOT need to be a Fellow.

One needs a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 current Fellows to act as references.

Nominations are now being accepted for the IEEE Fellows class of 2012. The deadline for nominations is 1 March 2011. If any one believes someone is worthy of this nomination from within the ranks, please speak to John and he will assist in the process. The sooner this process begins the better. Nomination forms normally need to be completed and submitted by February. It seems like a long way off but it's always best to start the planning now.

6) LIAISON REPORTS

a) IEEE IAS PUBLICATIONS – MARK WEAVER

Mark reported that 7 papers from this year's conference were submitted to the IAS Magazine for consideration and 6 papers were sent for publication in the IAS transactions.

b) IEEE/IAS - DAVE DUROCHER

Dave Durocher reported that PPIC committee members are well represented in the IAS. Blake Lloyd is the IAS president elect for year 2013-2014 and Dave Durocher is the current Process Industries Department Chair until the end of this year. At that point Dave moves into the vice-president role for IAS. Mark Weaver is continuing as the assistant editor of the IEEE Transactions on Industry Application. This participation has enabled PPIC to benefit as members of IAS in areas such as Society co-funding of the James A Rooks Student Intern program.

c) TAPPI - BURT JUDSON

Burt Judson reported that TAPPI, specifically the Electric Drives Committee, is still very active. With the success of the 8-hour drive system short course held at the 2009 PPIC conference, there is consideration of repeating that course at one of our future conferences – possibly 2012. The format would be somewhat more informal based on the feedback received in 2009.

TAPPI is still considering a future 1-1/2 day course with regard to "How to calculate drive/Winder HP Constants", which may be held either at Portland.

d) IEEE - STANDARDS PROJECTS COORDINATION - JOHN MALINOWSKI

John Malinowski reported the following:

IEEE Standards meet at the recent PCIC to review, revise and finalize these standards:

IEEE 841-2009 - Standard released 3rd quarter 2009. A new WG met and discussed comments on the existing standard and also the wish to add a section or mirror standard to address an IEC motor version of the standard.

IEEE 303-2004 is up for revision or affirmation. We voted to affirm as is.

P1349 - This continues with WG meetings several times a year in the Houston area.

P1599 - Large adjustable speed drives released 2009.

P1812 - Testing for permanent magnet machines. This is not meeting as part of PCIC but a new standard to specify how IPM machines are to be tested.

e) IEEE ELECTRICAL SAFETY WORKSHOP – LARRY THOMAS

Larry Thomas was not in attendance but Rhonda reported. The electrical safety workshop committee will meet in September 21 at San Antonio, TX at the PCIC conference. 8) SAN ANTONIO CONFERENCE REPORT – PETER BAEN

Peter Baen was not in attendance. There were some issues where not all attendees staying in the Omni La Mansion del Rio Hotel. The conference had 121 conference attendees including 3 students and 39 registered guests. There were 104 registered for the conference social event.

9) FUTURE CONFERENCES – JOHN MALINOWSKI

a) JUNE 19-23, 2011 - NASHVILLE, TN

John Malinowski provided both a verbal and video update on the Nashville conference. Hotel rate is \$165 a night. A local conference committee is all in place and they are ready for all of us to attend. The conference will start on June 19 (Sunday) and will be ended on June 22 (Wednesday). Social program, on June 22, will be at the Wild Horse Saloon. The guest program will include a shopping trip to Franklin, TN and to the Hermitage, Andrew Jackson's homestead.

Andrew Jackson always welcomed visitors to his home, The Hermitage. Since The Hermitage opened as a museum in 1889, over 15 million people have crossed its threshold. Our guests are invited to become part of that tradition.

All tutorials will be held on June 23 (Thursday).

b) 2012 AND BEYOND

2012 Conference – DAVE DUROCHER

Dave Durocher reported that the 2012 IEEE IAS PPIC Technical Conference will be return to Portland, Oregon June 17-21, 2012. We are looking at two "finalists" for hotels, The Portland Downtown Waterfront Marriott and a newly renovated hotel in downtown; The Nines, part of the Starwood properties. Both are walking distance to the Riverwalk as well as the Street Trolley and MAX Light-rail. Our hotel target room rate is \$160/night including internet and we are shooting for a slightly lower room block and Food & Beverage budget to assure we are "right-sized" for the present market conditions – which hopefully will have subsided by June 2012.

He already has George Matto as his finance chairperson.

2013 – Charlotte, NC. Darren Honaker is working on hotel selection. Location will either be in the downtown or on the outskirts of Charlotte.

2014 – Locations in the Midwest. Atlanta, Jacksonville or somewhere in Canada are under review.

10) NASHVILLE CONFERENCE TECHNICAL PAPERS – ALEX XU

Alex reported that there are 18 A's, 17 B's, 10 C's, 3 D's, 12 E's, 6 Tutorials and 3 Panel discussions proposed for the 2011 Nashville conference. There is also one presentation the will be given by Ben Johnson on recent changes to the NFPA-70E standard. Paper inclusion will be based on a first come first serve basis based on the ScholarOne entry criteria.

11) SCHOLARONE MANUSCRIPTS UPDATE - RHONDA BANKS/ALEX XU

Rhonda Banks has updated the 2011 Author's Guide to providing better instructions to authors for submitting papers into ScholarOne. Alex outlined that he will be utilizing ScholarOne to a fuller extent this year as we transition into that system.

12) OLD BUSINESS

a) AD HOC – SUSTAINABILITY – DAVE DUROCHER

Dave Durocher reported he continues to reach out to specific industry engineers to promote the conference. Save the date emails were sent in April and in May. He also follows up with those that attend the conference and those that did not.

Dave exchanged our committee list with the group who hosts the WOODTECH show in Portland every year. We obtained a list of 675 names. Conference promotion will start in February 2011 and specially target to the user group and the past attendees. Earlier solidification of the potential papers list will help to promote the conference.

Good quality tutorials will also draw user group to the conference as this is all necessary training for them.

b) Ad-Hoc – PERPETUATION COUNCIL (Open Position)

John Kay resigned from this position, due to other priorities, at the June conference. A new leader is needed. Volunteers should see Rhonda or John. Rhonda thanked John for his long tenure in this position and outlined the good things this group has done to date.

c) AD HOC COMMITTEE FOR THE JAMES A. ROOKS MEMORIAL INTERN PROGRAM- GREG DREWISKE

Three Interns were present for the 2010 San Antonio Conference:

Nathan Bays – MeadWestvaco, Covington, VA Matthew Little – NewPage Corporation, Wisconsin Rapids, WI Kyle Siefring - International Papers, Georgetown, SC Final cost for the 2010 program was \$5941.

Thanks to Dave Durocher for shaking a couple interns loose at the last minute. We had one intern go over the \$2000 limit and another was close due to late plane tickets. Overall, we stayed within the \$2000 per person budgeted. The difference between the \$600 travel that the Zucker Fund covered and what was needed was covered by the Rooks Fund. Greg further commented that the committee had an excruciating time getting the Zucker money of out IEEE due to this newly imposed \$600 limit on travel expenses. PPIC may need to rethink our approach given the \$600 limit on travel from the Zucker fund. Greg Drewiske reported three interns will participate in this year's conference and he will start to recruit new interns in February 2011.

Recommendations for 2011:

- The Local Committee should provide 2 queen rooms in Nashville as has been done in the past. This will eliminate the issues with hotel rooms for the interns.
- Approve a budget of up to \$8000 for 2011 for four interns

d) JAMES A. ROOKS MEMORIAL CONTRIBUTIONS - DAVE DUROCHER

Dave Durocher reported that the foundation has over \$111,000.00 including the \$30,000 matching fund from IEEE. The fund is planning to fund four students for the 2011 conference with \$2000.00 per student. 7

13) NEW BUSINESS

a) UPDATE FROM PETER BAEN – (RHONDA BANKS)

On Peter's behalf Rhonda wanted to acknowledge and thank John Kay for his efforts in updating the PPIC Local Conference Committee Guide. This is a great guide if it is used. Peter's team will provide feedback for revising the document.

b) EMERITUS UPDATE – DAVE DUROCHER

Dave Durocher is heading an ad hoc committee which is looking at the inclusion of a formal Emeritus Group within the PPIC. A group of 5 distinguished senior members of the IEEE IAS (John Bentley, George Matto, Larry Thomas, Stan Merritt, Daleep Mohla, Pat Link) participated in a teleconference June 10, 2010 and also a lunch meeting during the 2010 San Antonio Conference to discuss the idea of advancing an Emeritus program within the IEEE IAS PPIC. The stated purpose of the new initiative was to keep some of our "seasoned mentors" within the committee active and involved, even though they might not have a corporation sponsoring their participation. The group's response was focused on identifying specific activities where Emeritus could add value. There was push-back on the notion that there was a potential free-lunch out there. More work is needed to define the roles and responsibilities, how Emeritus are selected, and also to look at whether the conferences have the resources to help subsidize any potential costs. John Malinowski has agreed to join the group and help establish a PPIC structure for this new group. This group met with the PCIC Emeritus group in San Antonio, to glean ideas from their team.

c) INTERIM MEETING FORMAT – ALLEN LOWE

Allen would like this committee to consider an alternative format to the formal interim meetings we have had in the past. The subcommittee he is apart of would like us to consider doing some type of video conferencing, net meeting or other like telecommunications method rather than people flying in from all parts of North America.

There was much discussion around this topic with pros and cons suggested from both sides. It was recommended that an ad hoc committee be formed to review this as soon as possible and to come back with some recommendations to the executive.

The ad hoc group will be headed by Allen Lowe. Volunteers for this committee were John Malinowski, Larry Olsen, Bert Judson and Dave Rollay

d) OPEN VOLUNTEER POSITIONS – RHONDA BANKS

Rachel Bugaris has volunteered to take over the committee website from Blake. Blake will provide Rachel all of the information she needs to make the changes. Thanks you Rachel!

There are still several open positions,

A motion to adjourn was accepted from John Malinowski at 2:10 PM and was seconded by Allen Lowe.

Unanimously accepted, the meeting was adjourned.
