2012 PPIC COMMITTEE ANNUAL MEETING The Nines Hotel, Portland Oregon June 19, 2011 Minutes recorded by John A. Kay, PPIC Secretary

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1) WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS – Rhonda Sheppard

Rhonda called the meeting to order at 3:05 PM. She provided a warm welcomed to everyone at the Portland Conference and to the Full Committee Meeting. Everyone in the room was asked to introduce him or herself including their company affiliation.

2) REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF CONFERENCE MEETING – JOHN KAY

John reported that the full committee interim meeting minutes, held in Atlanta, were distributed via email to those of the committee and these same minutes were posted on the committee website <u>www.pulpandpapercommittee.com</u>. Larry Olsen motioned to approve the minutes and the motion was seconded by John Malinowski. The minutes were approved by the full committee.

3) EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT – John Kay

John reported that 11 members were in attendance at the Executive Committee meeting held Sunday June 17, 2012 at 3:30PM.

Some of the highlights of interest that were discussed:

- a) James A. Rooks Memorial Student Intern Program This year marks the 6th anniversary of this program where we have been able to sponsor electrical engineering students to participate in the conference. The pool of funding is still over \$100,000 but we encourage everyone to consider a financial donation to continue to sustain these funds.
- b) 2012 Conference Technical Program- Alex reported that the creation of the technical program went well. Alex worked with Louie Powell to better understand the ScholarOne program. Most papers were formalized by the end of February.
- c) 2010 San Antonio Conference Update Books are closed but not yet fully audited. Unfortunately Peter Baen was not able to be at the meeting. Currently it appears the conference lost just over \$8,000 even after the hotel forgave a room block attrition charge of >\$25,000.
- d) 2011 Nashville, audit complete and final IEEE report is due shortly reporting a net surplus of \$53,740!!
- e) Interim Meeting- Initial discussion centered on having the interim meeting in Atlanta. There was a lot of discussion surrounding this topic but the conclusion was that it should be brought back to this full committee for discussion. This will be discussed later in the agenda. Blake has offered to assume the role of Interim Facilities Coordinator as Dave Rollay has retired.
- f) Open Positions
 - i) Unusual Failure Moderator Stan Merritt will be asked to host this at this year's conference.
 - ii) Perpetuation Council Chair- Blake Lloyd has taken over this role from John Kay. Blake will be reengaging those on this committee.
 - iii) PowerPoint Operator We are looking for an operator for the 2012 conference. Roly Roberge will not be able to support as he is the Local chairman.

4) TREASURER'S REPORT/CONFERENCE AUDITS – GRED DREWISKE

Greg reported the financial status of our current, past and future conferences as follows:

2009 Conference – Robert Adams

The audit is completed, the results confirmed and they returned a surplus of **\$12,357** back to the IEEE. **CLOSED**

2010 Conference – Peter Baen (report given by Greg Drewiske)

The committee is still forecasting a LOSS of approximately \$8,000. The good news is that several penalties, including a guest room night attrition penalty fees of over \$25K, were avoided. Some costs were also absorbed by the PCIC as well.

2011 Conference – John Malinowski

The IEEE has acknowledged that we passed audit and the final updated report indicated a large surplus (\$53,740) which was sent back to the IEEE. IEEE's complaints were we didn't match our forecasted budget well. We had too much revenue and not enough expenses!

Other noteworthy feedback from the IEEE included being mindful of good record keeping and the need to provide a 1099 form for any prize paper awards. These are needed even though the amount is under \$600.

2013 Conference – Roly Roberge

Committee is forming up. Budget has been submitted and approved. We will be at the Omni Hotel which is in the downtown core of Charlotte. The rate will be \$153/night. The hotel is about 8 miles from the airport and so you can expect to pay \$35/40 for a Taxi. Parking at the hotel is \$22/day for valet or \$15 for self-parking. For free internet you must be an Onmi Club member.

The current plans are to have 22 exhibitors booths.

5) STANDING SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Ron Simpson was resubmitted, through our conference, for consideration for this year's class. Unfortunately Ron's nomination was not successful.

I am happy to report that again this year we have one nomination submitted from our committee.

I am honoured to say that **Stan Merritt** has been submitted for consideration. (Thanks goes to Larry Olsen who stepped in on my behalf to formally do the application as I wanted to be included as a reference for Stan. I can no longer submit an application and be a Fellow reference)

The IEEE Fellows Review Committee does not issue their report in late November so we will not know until next year's conference if Stan was successful. Any news of elevations submitted by our committee, as we did this year, will be announced by way of an email to our distribution list.

d) PAPER AWARDS/MAGAZINE AND TRANSACTIONS SUBMITTALS – MARK WEAVER

Mark provided an informal report given from the floor. Again this year there will be prizes for the 1st and 2nd place papers as well as the Best Mill paper. Ten to twelve papers where submitted for IAS Transactions or the IAS Magazine shortly after our last year's conference and the same process will occur this year.

e) PUBLICITY – ROB BOTELER

The Nashville conference paper awards were published in the 2012 Sept/Oct edition of the IEEE Industry Application Magazine.

(Rob) is stepped down from this position. We are looking for a volunteer to fulfill this role.

f) PPIC AWARDS NOMINATION – RORY JOHNSON

The awards for this year's conference were announced by way of the conference record. These award winners will be formally recognized at the awards banquet. Congratulations to Dave Durocher and Anibal Valenzuela. Nominations for the 2013 service awards need to be submitted by the

interim meeting in October. All subcommittee chairs were reminded to discuss nominations within their subcommittees.

6) LIAISON REPORTS

a) IEEE/IAS – DAVE DUROCHER

Our own Blake Lloyd is the IAS president elect for year 2013-2014. Mark Weaver is continuing as the assistant editor of the IEEE Transactions on Industry Application. This participation has enabled the PPIC to benefit as members of IAS in areas such as Society co-funding of the James A Rooks Student Intern program.

b) TAPPI - BURT JUDSON

Burt Judson reported that TAPPI continues to struggle. But, the Electric Drives Committee continues to be very active. TAPPI is hosting a 1 ½ day course on Paper Machine Drives this week (Thursday).

Thanks to the vendors for their support. John Kay will be the Technical Chairman for the 2013 and 2014 conferences.

11) SCHOLARONE MANUSCRIPTS UPDATE - ALEX XU

The process again went very well using this system. The 2012 Author's Guide was revised to included revised instruction to authors for submitting papers into ScholarOne. John Kay will be updating the Author's Guide for the 2013 conference.

Again this year they used an email blitz to over 1300 mill and wood products engineers (747/584). The number of engineers attending the conference is a high since 2004.

We expect to continue this process of an email blitz for the 2013 conference.

c) AD HOC COMMITTEE FOR THE JAMES A. ROOKS MEMORIAL INTERN PROGRAM- GREG DREWISKE

Greg reported that this year marks the 6th anniversary that we have been able to sponsor electrical engineering students.

Considering that we have four award winners this year, we will need to insure we can continue to fund this initiative for the future. This year our plan was to fund up to \$2000.00 per student with a maximum of four students.

E) CONFERENCE SURVEY – GREG DREWISKE

Greg announced that it will be our intention to send out a survey about two (2) weeks after the conference.

13) NEW BUSINESS

a) INTERIM MEETING – (BLAKE LLOYD)

Blake is taking over from Dave Rollay (retired). With on-going discussion about hosting a virtual meeting, it was still felt that Atlanta was still a good location to host a formal interim meeting.

Blake suggests we try and set up individual WebEx type meetings for each subcommittee ONLY to encourage more participation. Blake will discuss with committee heads.

It was discussed at length about whether or not the main committee meeting should be in a teleconference (WebEx) style. But, it was agreed by consensus that large meetings of that type do not work well. There is too much interaction, background noise and it just becomes chaotic. We will proceed with a formal meeting.
