

IEEE Kingston Section Awards 2013

The IEEE Kingston Section is pleased to call nominations for the following 2013 section awards:

I- IEEE Graduate Research Awards

This award is intended to recognize excellence in graduate research in two award categories:

- 1) Research Excellence Award – PhD
- 2) Research Excellence Award – MSc

Award Eligibility

- Current member of the IEEE Kingston Section, or current student member of the IEEE Kingston Section who are enrolled in a graduate program at the time of application, OR
- IEEE Members or IEEE student members who have graduated after June 1st, 2012 from either competing graduate categories (i.e. MSc/ PhD) and have been IEEE Kingston Section members at the graduation date.

Exclusion: The winners of these awards in the past years are not eligible to apply in the same category again.

Application procedure

Submit the following documents:

- 1) Curriculum Vitae including all publications with complete bibliographic information.
- 2) One page research summary in layman terms including significance and potential impact of the contributions.
- 3) One sample publication of most significant impact of your research.
- 4) Up to two letter(s) of support from faculty advisor(s) or external reviewers. Please disclose any past collaboration or relationships with external reviewers.

Review process

- 1) MSc and PhD files will be reviewed separately.
- 2) Each file will be assigned to at least two independent reviewers.
- 3) Adjudication will be based on the following criteria: impact, publications, and awards.

II-Outstanding Engineering Teaching Award

This award is intended to recognize an educator who has shared technical and professional abilities through teaching in industry, government, or in an institution of higher learning and in so doing has made an outstanding contribution to the profession.

Award Eligibility

- Current member of the IEEE Kingston Section, or have been a member of IEEE Kingston section at the time of contribution.

Application procedure

Submit the following documents:

- 1) Curriculum Vitae.
- 2) Statement of Teaching.
- 3) One page summary of the nominee's career, including years and positions, emphasizing contributions made to engineering education.
- 4) List the nominee's teaching contributions, patents, proprietary designs, papers, technical presentations, etc. (You may also provide any additional information that supports the nominee's qualifications).
- 5) Summary of recognition (s) for education and teaching institution.

Review process

- 1) Each file will be assigned to at least two independent reviewers.
- 2) Adjudication will be based on the following criteria: Significance of teaching contributions and impact of contributions in increasing knowledge in profession.

III- Outstanding Volunteer Award

This award is intended to recognize outstanding volunteering service and significant contributions to the advancement of the IEEE Kingston Section activities. Selection of the winner will be based on merit and number of initiated activities.

Award Eligibility

- Current member of the IEEE Kingston Section, or have been a member of IEEE Kingston section at the time of contribution.

Application procedure

Submit the following documents:

- 1) Curriculum Vitae.
- 2) List the activities contributed by the potential nominee.
- 3) Summary of contributions that warrant this potential nomination (Maximum 100 words).

Review process

- 1) Each file will be assigned to at least two independent reviewers.
- 2) Adjudication will be based on the following criteria: Significance of activities and number of contributions.

Results will be announced at the IEEE Kingston section annual banquet. The winners are expected to attend the banquet and receive their awards. The short list of top applications in each category will be notified by email before the annual banquet date to confirm their attendance.

Note: Individuals can nominate others for the category II and III awards. In such cases, the nominator will have to ask the nominee to submit the supporting material to the nominator or directly to the Section Awards Chair. This is not allowed in the category I (Graduate Research Awards).
