5. Recommended Changes to Annex G – Bibliography

Surresh, Chris and Steve provided excellent updates for their assigned sections of the Annex.

Discussed whether we should include dates or revision numbers, and whether the existing date/revision should be changed to the latest.

The existing version in Annex G is what we wrote the standard to. As a result, we should identify that reference and then we can say changes in later revisions don't apply or we can confirm the newest version is applicable and update the document date accordingly.

It was suggested we use a rev/date for external documents and not for IEEE. Determined the same need to identify what was used is needed.

For documents that have been withdrawn it is okay to leave the original reference in the bibliography if it is the historical basis for something in the standard, even if no longer available. But we should clearly identify it as withdrawn or inactive reserve if it is not a currently active standard.

For documents that are no longer available simply because they've become outdated and allowed to be removed from a register we need to decide what to do with those.

In either case, we need to understand where the document was used in our standard and how a change may have affected our use or content.

Rebecca – identified she still has an action to get copies of older IEEE transactions and other historical items into a reference archive on iMeet.

Koshy – even if it is no longer available, it is still what we used at the time. If withdrawn, just say so
