I. Announcements

 The Region 5 Annual Meeting is in Corpus Christi, Texas, April 5-6, 2014. The Section needs to send one or more delegates to this meeting. Region 5 will pay the expenses for one delegate. Debora Elam was appointed as the Pikes Peak Section delegate to the Region Five Annual Meeting in Corpus Christie, Texas.

II. Discussion

a. 2014 IEEE Sections Congress attendance (vote)

• This year's Sections Congress will occur August 22-24 in Amsterdam, the Netherlands. Debora Elam, Lewis Dove and Dave Cotton all volunteered to attend. The Sections Congress is a an opportunity to support section administration, participate in leadership/technical activities, join in discussion sessions, and meet members and officers outside if our section. One delegate from Pikes Peak will attend, with Region 5 paying for travel expenses. Debora Elam was selected as this year's delegate. The section voted to send Lewis Dove and Dave Cotton, as well. Travel expenses for Dave Cotton and Lewis Dove to this year's Sections Congress will be paid from the

Pikes Peak Section Investment Account which currently stands at about \$48,000. Travel arrangements will need to be made by April 5th. <u>Note:</u> The Sections Congress meeting takes place once every three years. The next meeting will be in 2017.

b. 2014 IEEE Sections Congress recommendations

 John Reinert requested recommendations from the Pikes Peak Section for this year's Sections Congress. Historically, recommendations range from membership incentives to process improvements. On March 5th, Mr. Reinert sent an e-mail to Section Officers requesting inputs by March 6th. The recommendations will be voted on via an online survey, with the top four from the Region sent forward to the Sections Congress.

- John Santiago discussed this year's Engineering Summit. CTU presented five projects:
 - 1. An omni-directional rover using Mecanum wheels
 - 2. A Tesla coil to demonstrate wireless energy/power
 - 3. Jacobs's Ladder
 - 4. A Dirt battery that lights up an LED.
 - 5. A simple home-made motor

Part of the booth included past student efforts: student-built rovers and a robot arena initiated by a student who created an educational robotics hobby company. Also, a quadrotor was flown, and the Xbox Kinect camera was used to attract young kids with application to animation (with potential tele-presence medicine for the future).
