<p><b>NEW BUSINESS – P0</b></p>	<p>On behalf of P0 Subcommittee, Tom Dahlin made the following motion: to have P0 take over as the lead Subcommittee or responsible Standards Committee for IEEE 2030 (upon confirmation by SC21 to no longer be the lead committee).</p> <p>The AOR of SCC21 has changed.</p> <p>The responsible working group in P0 is P18/SCC21 IEEE Std 2030. Guide for Smart Grid Interoperability of Energy Technology and Information Technology Operation with the Electric Power System (EPS), End-Use Applications, and Loads</p> <p>AOR was clarified as Area of Responsibility. After some discussion, Theo Laughner moved to amend the motion as such: to have PSCCC take over as the lead Committee or Responsible Standards Committee for IEEE 2030 (upon confirmation by SC21 to no longer be the lead committee).</p> <p>Jay Anderson seconded the motion. The motion carried by unanimous consent.</p>	<p>Tom Dahlin</p>
<p><b>NEW BUSINESS – S0</b></p>	<p>On behalf of S0 Subcommittee, Scott Mix made the following motion: for WG to form a ballot body for the standard IEEE P1711.1 – Serial SCADA Protection Protocol (SSPP) Guide for using Secure SCADA Communications Protocol (SSCP) and Serial SCADA Protection Protocol</p> <p>The responsible working group in S0 is S2. S2 will form a ballot body and anticipates request to go to ballot at May '23 meeting. S2 is resolving MEC comments.</p> <p>Theo Laughner seconded the motion. No discussion. The motion was passed by unanimous consent.</p> <p>A discussion on ballot pool votes occurred. It was noted that the motion may be precautionary and not required and that a clarification of procedures may indicate the vote to form a ballot pool is not required.</p>	<p>Scott Mix</p>

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<p><b>NEW BUSINESS – S0</b></p>	<p>On behalf of S0 Subcommittee, Scott Mix made the following motion: for Main Committee authorization for S0 officers and PSCCC Main Committee to work with IEEE SA to provide S5’s current draft of C37.240 document to ISA99 WG14 for their use.</p> <p>The responsible working group in S0 is S5 – PC37.240 Revision of IEEE C37.240 Cyber Security Requirements for Power System Automation, Protection and Control Systems. ISA99 is Industrial Society of Automation - Industrial Automation and Control Systems Security. S5 has stalled and ISA has taken over the scope of this work. S5 wants to provide their work to ISA99/WG14 for inclusion in their work, if needed.</p> <p>Theo Laughner seconded the motion. No discussion. The motion was passed by unanimous consent.</p> <p>Ken Fodero asked for clarification: C37.240 will not be transferred to ISA.</p> <p>Craig Preuss noted that he has recommended against the transfer since C37.240 uses the NIST-CSF as a baseline but ISA99 WG14 does not use the NIST-CSF. There is a chance of delaying the work based on discrepancies. Scott Mix noted that ISA99 WG14 has indicated they would be receptive to the document and its contents.</p> <p>The motion passed with 1 dissenting vote (Craig Preuss).</p>	<p>Scott Mix</p>

The working group will go inactive if/when PAR is withdrawn. If ISA99 work completes and S0 feels more work is required, this work will be done under a new PAR.</p> <p>Tony Johnson seconded the motion. No discussion. #### Summary of selection of memberplanet:

- 123Signup shut down occurred on December 31, 2021
- During July – October 2021, an ad hoc committee of Technical Committee leads met bi-weekly to develop a formal request for proposal (RFP), research suppliers, schedule demos, and review proposals to replace 123Signup services.
- In October 2021, the ad hoc committee decided upon memberplanet and sent their decision to the IEEE PES Technical Council Officers and VP of Technical Activities for review and approval.
- Decision to proceed with memberplanet as the new Association Management System (AMS) for IEEE PES Technical Council was approved in November 2021 by VP of Technical Activities. Memberplanet will be required of all PES Tech & Coordinating Committees to use to maintain their rosters and attendance moving forward per the [PES Tech Council O&P Manual](#).
- IEEE PES Executive Office will cover the cost of the annual contract for the memberplanet tool as part of the 2022 PES Budget except for pass-through charges for those technical committees who also choose to use the event registration features for their paid meetings (i.e. credit card transaction fees, badge creation fees, etc.)
